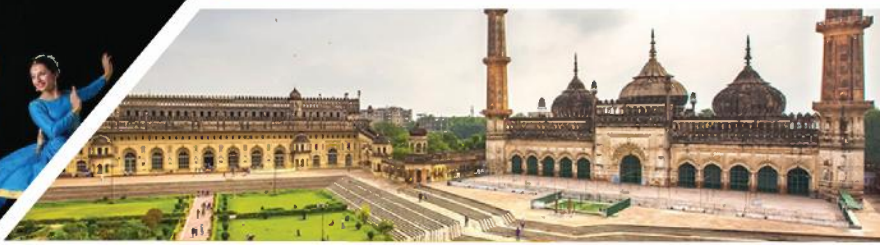


# NCED International Conference on Sustainable Practices for the Inclusion of Children with Hearing Impairment

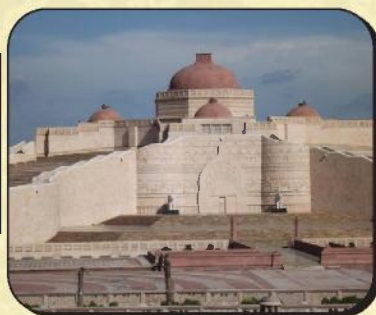

### **About NCED India**

The National Convention of Educators of the Deaf (NCED-India) is national level association of special educators, teacher educators and allied professionals working for the betterment of the education of children with hearing impairment. The inception of NCED-India dates back to 1935. It was then known as Convention of the Teachers of the Deaf (CTDI). CTDI was active in addressing the then issues of the deaf children and youth and was also publishing a quarterly scientific journal. The organization was renamed as The National Convention of Educators of the Deaf- India' (NCED-India) in 1992. NCED-India became a registered society in 1995 (1995-G.B.B.2D - Maharashtra state, Mumbai 1081) with its head office housed at Ali Yavar Jung National Institute for Speech and Hearing Disabilities, K.C. Marg, Bandra Reclamation, Bandra(W), Mumabi-50. The state wise chapters of NCED-India have also been established. These chapters hold state wise meetings and conferences regularly to address the regional issues pertaining to education of children with hearing impairment.

NCED-India is committed to work towards improving the quality of educational services provided to children with hearing impairment by empowering teachers and disseminating the best practices in the intervention of children with hearing impairment. This is achieved through the National as well International Conference held in various parts of the country in collaboration with the state chapters. NCED-India welcomes everyone in this endeavor.

## About DSMNRU
